Bring an appetizer, side dish, or dessert to share. Don't forget to pack your favorite crab picking tools and beverage.

The Club will supply wooden mallets, crab crackers, ice, bottled water, cocktail sauce, butter for corn, salt and pepper, cups, plates, utensils, and paper towels.

BY BOAT: You will find the Lake Ogleton entrance NW of AH (formerly Tolly Pt.). Be sure that the #1 & #5 Flashers stay lined up with your fore and aft stays.

Don't let the tide carry you out of the channel. Boats with 5' draft go in and out at all times with no trouble.

Once inside, bear to port and you will find plenty of room to anchor in good water.

The Clubhouse is at the East end of the lake at the marina. Just dinghy in!

BY LAND YACHT: 80 East Lake Drive, Annapolis, Md. Head East on Forest Drive (Rt. 655) from Rt. 2 at Parole, through nine traffic lights, at which time you will be on Bay Ridge Road. Pass the Bay Ridge gates and turn left onto East Lake Drive. Bear right and go 4/10 mile. Look for the "Bay Ridge Civic Association Clubhouse" sign to your left. Turn into the driveway and park.



ABOUT CHINESE GIFT EXCHANGE

You won't want to miss this always exciting and highly anticipated activity!

To participate, bring a wrapped gift. Each person that brings a gift can participate in the Exchange—one gift per person or couple, wrapped, and not identifiable as to content or who brought it (adds to the intrigue!).

The item can be previously owned/gently used in *very* good condition, re-gifted, or brand spanking new. All items should have a current value of \$15-\$20. A "gift" you would enjoy if you were on the receiving end. Any usable item for home, on the hook (think happy hour) or simply "messing around in boats."

NO gag gifts, please, rather an item with some useful purpose.

Game Rules as "Prescribed" by Doc Johnson

- 1. Each person bringing a gift draws a number to determine the order of gift selection. (If there are 20 gifts, then 1 through 20 numbers will be drawn.)
- 2. The person who draws the number "1" selects a gift from the pile, opens the gift, and sits down with the gift in plain sight.
- 3. Then the person holding number "2" selects a gift from the pile or "steals" the gift away from player "1".
- --If "2" steals "1's" gift, then player 1 again selects from the gift pile, but cannot steal back the gift from player "2".
- 4. The person holding "3" has the option to select from the gift pile or "steal" from player "1" or "2". The giftless person can select from the gift pile or steal from someone other than the person who just stole from them.
- 5. The same process repeats until everyone with a number has taken a gift. The player with the last number has the choice of stealing any of the previous gifts.

Toward the end of the game, it's not at all unusual for many gifts to move around in a single turn before somebody finally takes a gift from the pile.

6. The *only* rule of this game is that you cannot directly take back a gift that was just taken from you. But the very next time someone again steals your gift, you can steal back the earlier item, even if that person took it from you. No guarantee you'll keep the gift for long!
